

# Special Educational Needs and Disabilities Report 2014-15

## Students with Statements

Eight students with Statements including two in Y11 being moved over to Education Health Care Plans.

Four of these students are in KS3 and were given Statements this academic year. Two of these students are returning to their original mainstream school and the other two will be moving to special schools next term.

Two students (one KS2, one KS3) are currently being assessed for a probable EHCP.

All students with Statements are receiving full-time provision with the exception of one of the KS3 students who will be going to a special school full-time next term.

Academic progress is mixed but all students are engaging significantly better with education than they were when they started at SLC.
